


Ideal labelling for outer packaging for a non-cytotoxic product




Ideal labelling for outer packaging for a cytotoxic product




The main panel of this packaging has clear and legible font with adequate blank space to help readers focus on key information (generic name, strength, format and route of administration). Avoid crowding of information.


Ideal labelling for non-cytotoxic vial

Labelling Dos and Don'ts

Key Information – Outer Packaging



The key information is hard to find due to crowding of information on the main panel and small font size.




The main panel should have a clear and legible font with adequate blank space to help readers focus on key information (generic name, strength, format and route of administration). Avoid crowding of information.

Key Information – Vial




The key information is hard to find due to crowding of information and small font size.




The main panel should have a clear and legible font with adequate blank space to help readers focus on key information (generic name, strength, format and route of administration). Avoid crowding of information.

Case/Box Packaging – IV Bags



Highlight the key information on the shipping carton using font size and blank space. This should be printed on at least two non-opposing faces.




Labelling Dos and Don'ts

Label Orientation – Ampoules



Label Orientation – Small Vial




Orient labels on small containers longitudinally so information can be read without turning the container.

Label Orientation – Prefilled Syringes

Orient labels on prefilled syringes longitudinally so information can be read without turning the container. Graduations and markings on syringes should not be covered.
